Little Blessings Late Pick Up Policy

Children should be picked up promptly at or before the end of their scheduled program. Starting at five minutes after, parents will be called, and the late fees will be assessed. If you are running late, please notify us immediately, so that we can let your children know that you are on your way. Children will be brought to the preschool office and at this time parents will be called.

A late fee of \$5 will be assessed every five minutes. Your Procure account will be billed accordingly. Three late pick-ups will result in loss of your child's scheduled program.

PARENT READING TIPS

- Point at objects and name them (dog, cat, house)
- Talk back and forth with your baby
- Play games with them while you are reading

AGE 0-1

- Smile and answer your child's questions
- Encourage them to point at objects and name them
- Have them help turn the pages

AGE 1-2

- Ask them questions about the book
- Talk about the pictures and what the words mean
- Let them pick out the book they want to read
- Reward them and set goals for reading

AGE 2-3

- Point out letters and numbers
- Look at pictures and make up stories about them
- Talk about the different characters
- Ask them their take on the story

AGE 3-4

- Have your child tell the story
- Encourage writing and drawing
- Ask them the meaning of the story
- Have a conversation about what the words mean
